Try this at home:

Do a "Stretched-Out Story" with your child. Say, "I'm going to tell you a story, but some of the words will sound a little different. I'm going to stretch-out some of the words so you can hear all of the sounds in the words. It's your job to put the words back together." Tell any story, stretching a few ww-oo-rr-dd-z and pausing after the stretched-out word. Your child will learn how words are made up of letter sounds.

(Pretend to rub body with towel)

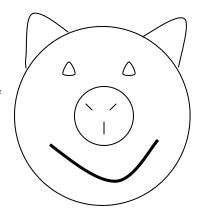
Hands to dry, and fingers and toes, And two wet legs and a shiny nose. (Point to named body parts)
