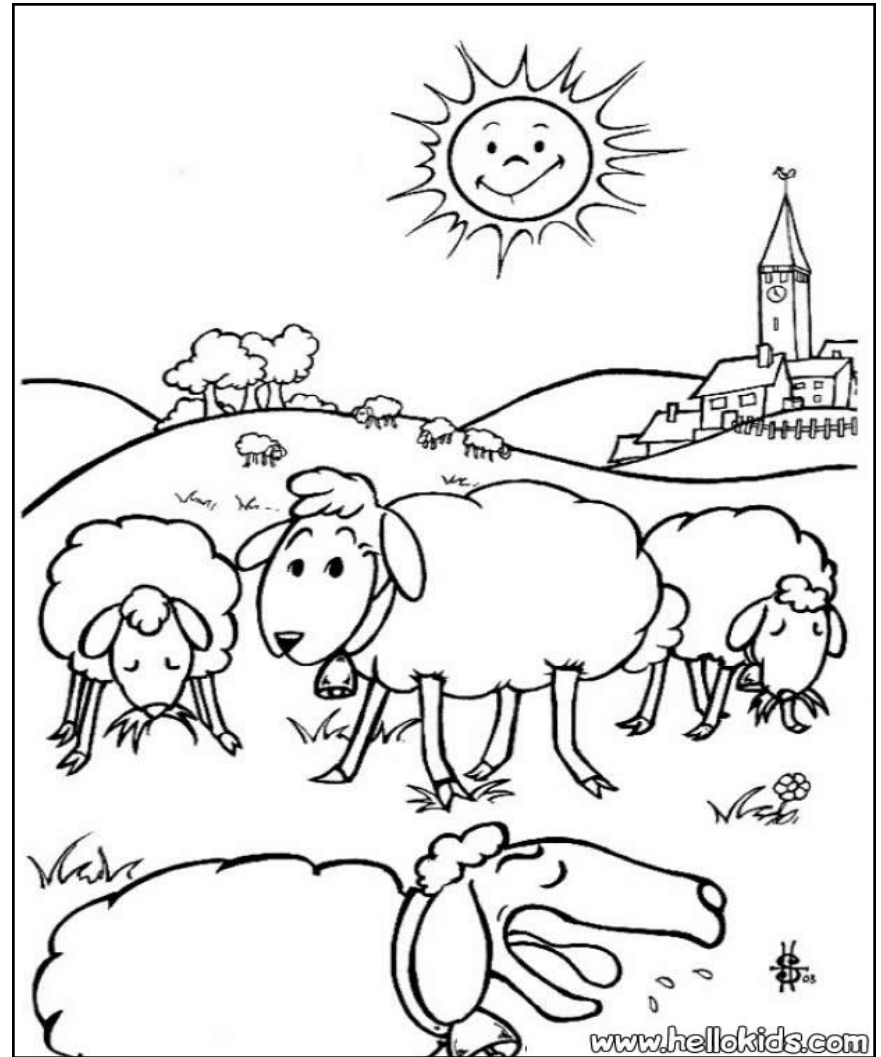
### Try this at home:

## Loud or Soft Activity

Materials You Will Need:

Large container, various objects

What To Do:

Children learn by using their sense of hearing.

Locate objects that make different sounds

(a wooden clothespin, paper clip, bell, golf ball, envelope, etc). Encourage your child to drop each object into the container. Have your child stand next to the container that is on the floor. Identify each sound as loud or soft.
